If you are ever drugged or robbed, be sure to report it to the police immediately. The police can help to catch the criminals and prevent them from hurting others.



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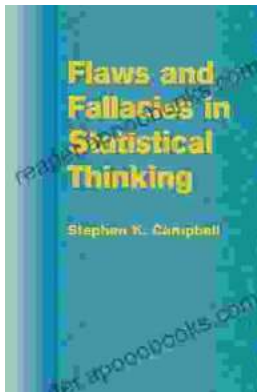
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
