
Dunblane Massacre: A Scottish Tragedy and the Harrowing Aftermath of Gun Control

The Horrific Event

At 9:40 AM, Hamilton entered the school while parents were dropping off their children. He was armed with four legally owned handguns, a total of 743 rounds of ammunition, and a large knife. The gunman entered the gymnasium, where the first-grade class was holding a physical education lesson.

Chaos ensued as Hamilton indiscriminately opened fire. Within minutes, 16 innocent children and their teacher, Gwenne Mayor, were murdered. The

police, responding to desperate calls, engaged Hamilton in a short shootout before he turned his gun on himself.

The victims of the Dunblane Massacre were 16 children aged 5 and 6:

Aftermath and Response


