- Vote for candidates who support public education

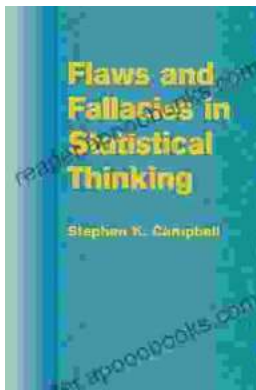
